Programs for Children and Families

All Ages Story Time: Come listen to a story, sing, dance, play, and learn with us at our weekly story time. This program is best for families with children under age 5, but is open to all. Seating is limited to the first 15 people with tickets. Tickets can be claimed on a first-come, first-served basis the day of the program at the Youth Services desk beginning at 9AM. Due to the popularity of our regularly scheduled story times, we typically cannot accommodate large school groups. Please call Elia at 928-373-6468 to discuss alternative options for your larger group.

Evening Story Time: Not able to make it to our story times in the morning? No problem! Evening story time is for families with kids of all ages (though it's best for kids ages 2-6) who want to enjoy stories, songs and fun activities, but prefer to attend programs later in the day. Capacity will be limited, so stop by the Youth Services desk after 5PM to claim your ticket.

Barks and Books: Children ages 6 -12 are invited to sign up to read to one of our friendly guide dogs, Bella and Ricky. Reading to dogs has been shown to help improve emerging reading skills and make children more confident readers. Slots are limited, so sign up for your spot at the Youth Services desk starting at 9AM the day of the program.

Lego Club: Make new friends and build as far as your imagination will allow at our after school architecture-based Lego program. This program is for kids ages 8-12 and their caregivers aged 16 and older.

Kandinsky for Kids: Did you know some people can see sounds? It's very rare, but it's a real condition called synesthesia, and painter Wassily Kandinski had it! Join Miss Jennichelle as she teaches kids ages 8-12 about this famous painter, and experience how he created his art by painting along to classical music. Space is limited so pick up a ticket at the Youth Services desk starting at 9AM on the day of the program.

Programs for Teens

Ozbot Coding Challenge: Use Ozobot coding robots to learn basic coding, done through a series of color codes. Using maze templates and obstacles courses, teens will be tasked with creating codes for their robots which work forwards and backwards.

Jelly Soaps: Learn to make jelly style soaps using household materials you likely have in your home. Explore the science behind why these ingredients change the texture of soaps from a normal bar soap type to the jelly consistency.

Board Game Club: Teens, come learn to play a new tabletop game, learn some fun facts and history about each game and make friends at our new Board Game Club. Each week in October we will feature a new game (like Sushi Go!, Dos, Monopoly and Settlers of Catan). It's ok if you have never played them, we will teach you how! Open to teens ages 13-18 only please.

Eventos en Español

Beginner ESL Classes: La biblioteca principal ya ofrece clases de inglés. Aprenderá frases comunes, vocabulario básico y gramática básica para principiantes. Toda persona adulta interesada es bienvenida. Esta clase es gratuita para todos.

Programs for Adults

Drop In Device Help: Drop-in for help with devices, apps, technology, and library-related e-resource questions. No registration required. Please bring your devices with you.

Fala Muito Bem: This Portuguese Club allows you to practice your Portuguese individually and seek support from peers. Participants will be using Mango Language, a free resource offered by the library, on their personal device then engage in conversation using prompts.

Resume Workshop: Participants will learn how to effectively create and use resumes in order to get a better position or transition jobs. Learn the differences between a functional resume, chronological resume, and traditional resume, and which situation each is used. By the end of the class, participants will create a resume to take with them.

Yuma Yarnaholics: Welcome knitters, crocheters and crafter's of all kind! Come learn the basics of knitting and crochet or challenge yourself with more advanced projects. Supplies provided to begin learning, but selection for individual projects is the student's responsibility. Returning students may chose to do independent study or follow a plan of challenged learning.

Spanish Club: Learn the basics of speaking Spanish. Participants will learn vocabulary, practice essential Spanish phrases, and work with a variety of free resources.

Small Business Development Center (SBDC) Business Counseling: The Arizona Small Business Development Center Network provides high quality, high impact one-on-one counseling, resource assistance and training to preserve and create small business jobs and revenue, and to facilitate capital formation throughout Arizona. One-on-one assistance. Help is provided on a first come first serve basis.

Great Readers Book Club: A book discussion group where readers can come together to talk about books and share their reading experience. The group will discuss a pre-selected book through guided reading questions and share their thoughts and impressions about the book.
